

This is not for lack of Christian hospitality. Rather, it is the recognition by the Catholic Church that real divisions of faith and practice do sadly exist among Christians. Practicing Catholics who go to Confession whenever needed are invited to receive Holy Communion. Non-Catholic Christians and those Catholics who should not receive Holy Communion (including those married outside the church and those in need of the sacrament of Penance) are asked to pray for a spiritual communion with the Lord Jesus and for the unity of His Church. Those who are not receiving Holy Communion but who would like to receive a blessing are invited to indicate this desire by crossing their arms across their chests as they approach the priest in the Communion procession.

UNBEARABLE SUFFERING

Save some, by snatching them out of the fire. -Jude 1:23

Living in a war-torn time period, Blessed Stanislaus Papcynzski – founder of the Marians of the Immaculate Conception – witnessed thousands of casualties on battlefields and also from dreaded plagues. He was deeply saddened to observe how many people died with no time to prepare to meet their maker.

After he experienced visions of the holy souls in purgatory, he was moved to engage in, and advocate for, prayer and penance on behalf of the dead.. In one account, at a gathering of family, friends, and religious, Blessed Stanislaus had a profound mystical experience of the holy souls in Purgatory. He later told his confreres: "Pray, bretheren, for the souls in purgatory, for they suffer unbearably." He then locked himself in his cell and spent three days praying for them.

CURED A BAD MEMORY

Pope Pius IX appointed Father Tomaso as a bishop of a diocese. Father Tomaso had a bad memory, which he thought would be a detriment to the office.
