The Virtue of Modesty

I think that when most people think of the virtue of modesty, they think of proper dress. Certainly proper dress falls under modesty, but the virtue itself is actually a broader than mere dress. Modesty is the virtue by which we regulate our externals in accord with the situation. In regards to

clothing, I am blessed that we do not generally have any grievous issues with people showing too much skin at Saint Thomas Aquinas or Our Lady of Mercy (as a side note, at many churches in Italy there are signs which show acceptable and unacceptable coverage; their rules are clear and enforced: shoulders and knees must be covered, and no midriff). But proper dress extends to more than merely "wearing enough;" there is a reason that we refer to wearing our "Sunday best" to Mass. Moderating our dress in accord with the dignity of the Mass is also important. If we show up for Mass suitably dressed for doing yard work, then we need to stop and take account of the the great mystery which is taking place on the altar and the fact that we are in God's house, not the greenhouse.

Moderation of externals extends itself to speech (thus using profane language - "four letter words" - is an offense against modesty). Both of these activities should be moderated, once again, by the fact that when we are in church, we are in God's house. As our Lord reminded us when He cleansed the Temple of the moneychangers, "It is written, 'My house will be called a house of prayer'" (Matthew 21:13). Our churches are houses of prayer. So our behavior should accord with this



purpose; the church is not a saloon or a social hall. That's not to say that we shouldn't talk at all in church, but at the very least moderating the volume of our voices, going outside when the weather permits, not disturbing those who are trying to pray are all considerations. This is especially true before Mass. Pope Francis commented, "When we go to Mass, perhaps we arrive five minutes early and begin to chat with the person next to us. But this is not the moment for chitchat; it is the moment of silence to prepare ourselves for the dialogue. It is the moment for recollection within the heart, to prepare ourselves for the encounter with Jesus. Silence is so important!"

Connected with speaking in church is a different manner of making noise: clapping and applause. Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, before he became Pope Benedict XVI, wrote, "Whenever applause breaks out in the liturgy because of some human achievement, it is a sure sign that the essence of liturgy has totally disappeared and been replaced by a kind of religious entertainment." The truth is that we go to Mass to render right worship to the true and living God; the Mass is not about us. Pope Saint John XXIII, who was known for his affability and sense of humor, after entering a church to applause said, "I am very glad to have come here. But if I must express a wish, it is that in church you not shout out, that you not clap your hands, and that you not greet *even* the Pope, because 'templum Dei, templum Dei' [The temple of God is the temple of God]." And Pope Saint Pius X said, "It is not fitting to applaud the servant in his Master's house."
